To receive credits, regular attendance during the semester and a final exam are required. |

| ECTS Credit System and Workload | <p>1 academic year = 60 credits 1 semester = 30 credits</p> <p>One credit reflects a workload of 25-30 hours, including classroom time, labs, preparation, homework, etc. A standard semester consists of 30 credits.</p> |
| Grading System | <p>1,0 – 1,3 sehr gut (very good) 1,7 – 2,3 gut (good) 2,7 – 3,3 befriedigend (satisfactory) 3,7 – 4,0 ausreichend (sufficient) 5,0 mangelhaft (not sufficient, fail)</p> |
| VISA / Residence Permit | <p>EU citizens: A residence permit can be obtained after arrival. Registration at the City Registration Office (Einwohnermeldeamt/Buergerservice) is required.</p> <p>Non-EU students must generally apply for a Student Visa at the German Embassy / Consulate in their home country (exceptions for American, Canadian, Australian and some other nationalities). For further information see https://www.daad.de/en/study-and-research-in-germany/plan-your-studies/visas/ and https://www.auswaertiges-amt.de/en/visa-service.</p> <p>Important notice: If you are allowed to enter Germany without a student visa (e.g. if you have Australian or American citizenship) you will not be allowed to take a student job until you have applied for your student residence permit at the local Foreigners' Office (request for appointments in Aachen: auslaenderamt@staedteregion-aachen.de).</p> <p>Non-EU students coming from a partner university within the European Union: If you have a valid student residence permit from another EU country for the complete duration of a planned mobility programme with a maximum duration of 360 days (e.g. ERASMUS+), you may apply <u>in advance</u> for your entry permit to Germany according to the European directive 2016/801/EU ("REST"). All required documents must be submitted to our exchange coordinator Britta Ritzal (ritzal@fh-aachen.de) at least 4-6 weeks before the beginning of the mobility programme.</p> |

| <p>VISA / Residence Permit</p> | <p>Please contact your exchange coordinator at the FH Aachen in advance in order to get a prior confirmation if this rule applies to you, so that you can avoid a visa application at a German embassy.</p> <p>Attention: The residence permit of another Schengen country is <u>not automatically valid for studies in Germany</u>, but only for a visit as a tourist for a duration of 90 days.</p> <p>You may not study in Germany without the written confirmation by the EU directive ("REST") or a normal student visa.</p> <p>Student visas <u>cannot</u> be obtained at the Foreigners' Office in Aachen or Kreis Dueren after arrival, but <u>only in advance</u> in the country of residence.</p> <p>After arrival and enrolment: 8-12 weeks before the entry visa expires, enrolled students who live in Aachen must apply for their student residence permit at the Foreigners' Office of the StaedteRegion Aachen in Aachen. Students who live in Juelich, Linnich, Dueren or another city within Kreis Dueren must apply for their student residence permit at the Foreigners' Office of Kreis Dueren.</p> <p>See also https://www.fh-aachen.de/en/studies/studying/information-for-international-students</p> |

| <p>Housing</p> | <p>The Department of International Affairs offers a limited number of rooms in student dorms to exchange and double degree students from partner universities and assists with finding a room.</p> <p>The average rent per month for a furnished room/apartment in Aachen or Juelich can range from €250 € to €400 or even more. Additionally, a security deposit of two or three months rent is often required.</p> |
| <p>Monthly Costs of Living</p> | <p>Costs of living in Aachen or Juelich sum up to approximately 900 € per month (including costs for housing, food, entertainment, books, transport, health insurance and personal expenses). The German embassies abroad and the Foreigners' Offices currently require proof of € 934 per month from applicants for a student visa or student residence permit.</p> |
| <p>Additional Fees</p> | <p>Administrative fee (this is not a tuition fee) of approx. €320 per semester is obligatory for enrolment (includes a ticket for free public transport in the German state of North Rhine-Westphalia (NRW), a student activity fee and university accident insurance).</p> |
| <p>Health Insurance Requirements</p> | <p>Valid health insurance is required for enrolment. Non-EU citizens can purchase public health insurance after arrival in Germany for approximately €110 per month. Travel health insurance for the first two weeks is highly recommended as the student health insurance only becomes valid upon enrolment.</p> <p>EU-citizens should bring their European Health Insurance Card (EHIC-Card).</p> |
